Project Overview

San Francisco attracts travelers from around the world. Visitors can arrive by car, public transit, ferry or bike. A diverse array of activities are waiting. The challenge is how to choose from so many options in one day or more?

Rails to Trails Conservancy was developing a series of City Guides - a web-based map and visual guide to cities with extensive trail networks. The project includes:

- Overview of the city's trail network
- Two self-guided trail tours one walking, one cycling to demonstrate how trails link across the city.
- Planning your visit sidebar with transportation options and seasonal weather tips
- List of top multi-use trails with short description of each
- Spreadsheet with specific points of interest including hotels, bike shops, outfitters, attractions and historic attractions
- Websites as helpful resources for visitors

Outcome

Golden Gate Park, The Presidio, Embarcadero and Lands End were specially featured for trails, walks and historic destinations. Guide also includes short narratives describing landmark hostels, signature restaurants, bike rental shops and multiple transportation options.
